During the UEFA Euro 2008<sup>™</sup> in June 2008, football reigned supreme in Vienna. On the 29<sup>th</sup> June 2008, Spain was crowned Champions at the Ernst Happel Stadium in Vienna. On the 31<sup>st</sup> January 2010, the new European Men's handball champion France was crowned in the Stadthalle arena at the 2010 EHF EURO. Once again, from 10-22 January 2020, the Stadhalle arena played host to the preliminary and main rounds of the first Men's EHF EURO with 24 participating teams.

Of course, there are many more things to see and do in Vienna, Austria's capital with 1.9 million inhabitants. Whether you like art and culture, architecture or sports, Vienna has a lot to offer for everyone. Come and enjoy the pulsating life in the city's streets or visit one of the many green parks and gardens to chill and relax. Here is a brief overview of Vienna's most important sights. ### Viennese cuisine

Tourists and locals alike can discover a wide variety of culinary delights in this city that is known for its appreciation of fine flavours. From the traditional Viennese coffee houses and haute cuisine to the hearty meals served in Vienna's inns, this city offers the finest foods and drinks for every palate and budget. Enjoy choice wines, tasty beef dishes or the typical Viennese Kaiserschmarrn (a kind of scrambled pancake with raisins, served with stewed fruit) in select restaurants and inns all around Vienna. More Viennese specialties can be found at the traditional Coffee houses, Inns(Beisln), Heurigen and Sausage stands where you can be sure to meet Viennese people and experience their true "souls" in a relaxed atmosphere.



# **EHF Women's Handball Board**

In June 2012, based on a successful Congress motion in Monte Carlo, the Women's Handball Board (WHB) was established as the strategic platform of the EHF for the increased development and improved participation of women's handball in Europe, including the participation of the related stakeholders: national teams, clubs, leagues, and players.



The WHB main objectives are:

- Enhancing the image/attractiveness/brand of women's handball raising visibility
- Further development of the EHF competitions/main products: Women's EHF Champions League & Women's EHF FINAL4 and Women's EHF EURO
- Enhancing the status of women involved in handball
- Strengthening women's youth handball
- Improving the status of women's handball in emerging handball nations

The WHB plays an advisory role through supply of analysis and reports to the Executive Committee and contributes to the decision making process through its chairperson, who is a member of the Executive Committee. Based on the National Federations, Clubs and Players survey, the WHB is updating their action plan yearly and undertaking the projects in the areas of handball education, development and promotion.

The WHB consist of six (6) members (both female and male), representing stakeholders: National Federations (3), Leagues (1), Clubs (1) and Players (1) as well as (2) nominated representatives of the Executive Committee.

Nodjialem Myaro/FRA was elected in 2016 by the six WHB members as the chairperson of the EHF Women's Handball Board for the period 2018-2021.

The WHB is working in close collaboration with the EHF Technical Commissions and in educational programmes for female coaches, referees, delegates and sport managers with the EHF Competence Academy & Network (CAN).



# **EHF Workshop Objectives**

In the efforts to further develop women's handball in Europe, the EHF is dedicated to STRENGTHENING WOMEN'S HANDBALL NETWORK. Therefore the Women's Handball Board (WHB) initiated a workshop for persons responsible for women's handball within the Member Federations with the aim of presenting them the updated women's handball objectives and the outcomes of their initiatives as well as to exchange best practices and to receive their input for the future cooperation.

Furthermore the WHB would like to encourage the Member Federations, and more specifically the person responsible for women's handball in each nation, to embrace as well as actively promote the agreed aims, objectives and initiatives.

With the perspective on the better future of women's handball, the additional targets primarily focus on youth handball as well as the enhancement of the image and brand of women's handball, raising visibility and the further development of top products.

In 2020, additional targets are:

- Educational initiatives: promotion of the EHF education and further education courses for coaches and sport managers
- **Development initiatives:** talent management & EHF Respect Your Talent projects in connection with the EHF Media communication and raising visibility, mentoring of coaches in women's youth handball
- **Promotional initiatives:** award for top female leadership (female coach of the season, All-star team at the Women's EHF EURO), EURO promotion by the role models

We hope that the compiled programme will prove to be interesting for you.

Many thanks to the EHF Executive Committee who have agreed to support the workshop and to cover the accommodation and boarding costs of the participants, ensuring better workshop attendance.
